

ATTENTION UCLA GRADUATE STUDENTS INTERESTED IN TEACHING ASSISTANTSHIPS FOR AY 2017-2018

The UCLA César E. Chávez Department of Chicana and Chicano Studies is currently seeking UCLA graduate students to fill teaching assistantships for the 2017-2018 academic year. Applicants must be registered UCLA graduate students during AY 2017-2018 and in good academic standing. Graduate students in all disciplines are welcome to apply, we encourage social sciences and humanities to apply. Prior Chicana/o Studies coursework preferred, but not required. Previous TA experience not required.

Responsibilities of a TA in Chicana/o Studies courses may include, but are not limited to: (1) attending all class lectures; (2) preparing and leading discussion section; (3) grading exams, essays, and student journals; (4) keeping a grade book; (5) monitoring student attendance; (6) participating in meetings with the professor and other TA's. Moreover, it is a common practice to allow teaching assistants to deliver a lecture on a topic related to the course during the quarter.

TA Requirements

- Registered and enrolled as a UCLA graduate student
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units and be in good academic standing
- Hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 at the time of appointment
- No incompletes at the time of appointment
- NOT have a 50% appointment at the time of appointment
- Must read all reading assignments for course assigned

We highly recommend that you enroll in course CS495 Learner-Centered Teaching in Chicana/Chicano Studies offered in Spring 2017. Please forward your CV along with a cover letter including: (1) percentage of time (25% or 50%) and availability for the 3 quarters; (2) faculty name of advisor; (3) graduate standing (i.e. first year MA, third year Ph.D.); (4) two names of faculty references with contact information; and (5) prior Chicana/o Studies courses taken to the César E.
