All courses used to fulfill requirements for the minor must be 4 or 5 units and taken for a letter grade.

To apply for the minor, students must (1) have an overall grade-point average of 2.0 or better and (2) and schedule an appointment with our Undergraduate Counseling Office by visiting Bunche Hall 7351 or calling at 310-206-7696.

A maximum of 4 units of special studies courses (197, 199) approved by the advisor may be applied toward the minor. No course for the minor or preparation for the minor may be taken on a P/NP grading basis. A minimum of 20 units applied toward the minor requirements must be in addition to units applied toward major requirements or another minor.

Each minor course must be taken for a letter grade, and students must have an overall grade-point average of 2.0 or better. Successful completion of the minor is indicated on the transcript and diploma.
